

## **Peculiarities of the admission to study at the University of foreigners and stateless persons**

Foreigners and stateless persons are admitted to study at the University in accordance with Chapter XIV of the Admission Rules.

Foreigners and stateless persons (hereinafter - foreigners) can obtain higher education at the expense of individuals and/or legal entities (contract).

Admission of citizens of the Republic of Poland to state-ordered seats is carried out in accordance with Point 5 of Section III of the Admission Rules.

Applications and documents from foreigners for obtaining the Master's degree of Medical and Pharmaceutical directions are being received:

- from June 01, 2023 until December 14, 2023 (autumn semester),
- from December 16, 2023 until March 14, 2024 (spring semester).

The entrance tests for foreigners are held:

- from August 15, 2023 until December 15, 2023 (autumn semester),
- from January 15, 2024 until March 15, 2024 (spring semester).

Foreigners entering the 1<sup>st</sup> year of study participate in the competition according to the results of the entrance tests in the following competitive subjects:

- English or Ukrainian Language;
- Chemistry.

The entrance test results are evaluated on a scale from 100 to 200 points according to the evaluation criteria.

Competition score (CS) is calculated by the following formula:

$$\text{Competition score (CS)} = C1 * P1 + C2 * P2;$$

where P1 – assessment of the entrance test in English or Ukrainian language; P2 – assessment of the entrance test in Chemistry (on a scale from 100-till 200). Coefficients C1, C2 are set by the University up to 0,01. Coefficients C1, C2 are: for English language (first subject) – 0.50; for Chemistry (second subject) – 0.50.

### **Admission algorithm for citizens of the Republic of Poland**

The admission of citizens of the Republic of Poland is regulated by the Order of the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine No. 276 dated March 15, 2023, "About Approval of the Procedure for Admission for obtaining Higher Education in 2023", registered in the Ministry of Justice of Ukraine on March 28, 2023 under No. 519/39575, Admission Rules to study for obtaining the Higher Education at Danylo Halytsky Lviv National Medical University in 2023 year (hereinafter - Admission Rules) approved by the Academic Council of the University, Minutes 3-BP dated 04/26/2023,

and the Law of Ukraine "About establishing Additional Legal and Social Guarantees for citizens of the Republic of Poland, which are in the Territory of Ukraine".

According to Point 5 of Section III, citizens of the Republic of Poland have the right to obtain higher education on an equal basis with citizens of Ukraine, in particular at the expense of the state budget.

According to Point 2 of Section V, the application process **begins on July 19 and ends at 6:00 p.m. on July 31.**

Citizens of the Republic of Poland submit an Application in person in paper form to the admission commission (Point 3, Section VI).

When submitting an Application in paper form, the entrant personally presents the Originals:

- 1) Birth Certificate + copy;
- 2) Identity document + copy;
- 3) Document about a previously acquired educational degree, on the basis of which admission is made, and an appendix to it + a copy;
- 4) Original and a copy of the Matriculation Examination Certificate ("Matura Certificate");
- 5) four colour photos measuring 3x4 cm;
- 6) Motivation letter.

The documents specified **in points 2 - 4** must be translated into Ukrainian language with a notarized translation.

The documents specified **in points 3 - 4** must be certified in the country of their issuance in the manner that is officially used in this country for such certification, and legalized by the relevant foreign institution of Ukraine, unless otherwise provided by international agreements of Ukraine.

Entrants who take part in the competitive selection for admission to the non-budgetary competitive offer "Medicine taught in English" additionally submit one of the following documents to the admissions commission to confirm English language proficiency when meeting the enrollment requirements:

- English language proficiency certificate;
- Motivation letter written in English;
- another document that certifies knowledge of the English language.

The results of the competitive selection for the places of the state order will be made public no later than **August 5**.

Fulfillment of requirements (acceptance of documents) for enrollment in state order (budget) places **from August 5 till 18:00 August 8**.

Fulfillment of requirements (acceptance of documents) for places financed by the funds of individuals and/or legal entities (Contract) **from August 9 to 17.00. on August 14**.

The Order for enrollment in state-sponsored study places - **August 10**.

The Order about admission to study at places financed by the funds of individuals and/or legal entities - **August 15**.

To participate in the competition, you need to submit a Matriculation Exam Certificate **in two main subjects** (Polish language, Mathematics) and **one additional subject** (a Foreign Language, or History, or Biology, or Physics and Astronomy, or Chemistry **according to the choice of the Entrant**) - Point 3, Section VII.

The transfer of test scores of Matriculation Exam results to the 100–200 scale is carried out in accordance with the tables given in Appendix 6:

The competitive score is calculated according to the formula:

Competition score (CS) =  $(C1 \times P1 + C2 \times P2 + C3 \times P3) / (C1 + C2 + C3)$ ,

where

P1, P2, P3 – grades from the first, second and third subjects;

If the entrant's competitive score exceeds 200, it is set equal to 200;

Weighting coefficients (C1, C2, C3) of subject evaluations for each specialty are defined in Appendix 3:

The competitive score **cannot be less than 150 points** - for obtaining a Master's degree in Specialties 221 "Dental Studies", 222 "Medicine", 228 "Pediatrics" in the field of knowledge 22 "Health Care" (Point 7, Section VII).

The competitive score **cannot be less than 140 points (120 points** for admission to places at the expense of individuals and/or legal entities) for Specialty 226 "Pharmacy and Industrial Pharmacy" (Point 7, Section VII).

The Competitive Score is calculated according to the formula:

$$\text{Competition Score (CS)} = (C1 \times P1 + C2 \times P2 + C3 \times P3) / (C1 + C2 + C3)$$

**Example 1:** Polish Language 160 points; Mathematics 158 points; Foreign Language – 170 points

$$160 \times 0,35 + 158 \times 0,4 + 170 \times 0,25 / (0,35 + 0,4 + 0,25) = \mathbf{161,700 \text{ points}}$$

**Example 2:** Polish Language 160 балів; Mathematics 158 points; Chemistry – 170 points

$$160 \times 0,35 + 158 \times 0,4 + 170 \times 0,35 / (0,35 + 0,4 + 0,35) = \mathbf{162,455 \text{ points}}$$

**Example 3:** Polish Language 160 балів; Mathematics 158 points; Biology – 170 points

$$160 \times 0,35 + 158 \times 0,4 + 170 \times 0,5 / (0,35 + 0,4 + 0,5) = \mathbf{163,360 \text{ points}}$$
