Assessment Criteria for Practical Class

- 1. Knowledge of the theoretical material has significant errors, the initial knowledge test is written for less than 50.00%, unsatisfactory examination of the patient (unsatisfactory rating for practical skills), the main control work on the studied topic is written for an unsatisfactory rating, the student makes mistakes that can lead to the patient's death unsatisfactory.
- 2. Knowledge of the theoretical material has errors that, however, cannot endanger the patient's life, the initial knowledge test is written at 50.00–69.99%, a satisfactory rating for the performed practical skills, the control work on the studied topic is written for a satisfactory rating, the student makes mistakes that lead to a prolongation of the diagnostic search but do not pose a threat to the patient's life satisfactory.
- 3. Knowledge of the theoretical material without errors, complying with the program, the initial knowledge test is written at 70.00–89.99%, a "good" rating for the performed practical skills, the control work on the studied topic is written for a "good" rating, the student does not make mistakes good.
- 4. Knowledge of the theoretical material without errors, complying with the program, excellent knowledge in basic disciplines that the student can use in therapy, the initial knowledge test is written at 90.00–100.00%, an "excellent" rating for the performed practical skills, the control work on the studied topic is written for an "excellent" rating, the student does not make mistakes, is able to examine the patient, interpret the results of examinations, and prescribe modern, individualized, dosage-adjusted treatment excellent.
