2. Short resume of the discipline

Medical Law is a body of laws, which regulates social relations arising in the cource of healthcare provision, used for diagnostic, preventive, therapeutic and rehabilitation purposes as well as in connection with pregnancy and childbirth, to ensure the right to healthcare.

Teaching the course "Medical Law" provided by professionals with higher legal education, who have a scientific PhD/Doctorate degree, with professional research focus on medical law. Having medical education as second higher education is desirable.

3. Objective and tasks of the discipline

- 1. Objective of the discipline is professional training of medical students in order to create and develop their competence in medical law aimed at getting the required amount of theoretical medical and legal knowledge, gaining practical skills in the health sector, the mastery of a sufficient level of legal culture and legal consciousness to maintain a balance of the relations between medico-legal relations participants and respecting human rights in the field of health care.
- **2. Tasks of the discipline** are the following: studying the course "Medical Law" is a necessary component to ensure comprehensive training and qualifications of doctors so that they can be competitive and ready for the challenges generated by practical medicine, regulatory and reformist changes in health care.
