STRUCTURE AND CRITERIA FOR GRADING THE EXAM

Social Medicine, Public Health for 4th year students 222 Medicine

Final control includes semester control and final certification of the student.

Semester control (current assessment)

<u>The maximum number of points</u> that a student can score for the current academic activity per semester for admission to the exam is **120 points**.

<u>The minimum number of points</u> that a student must score for the current academic activity for the semester to be admitted to the exam is **72 points**.

FINAL CONTROL (EXAM)

The maximum number of points that a student can score when taking the exam is **80 points**.

The minimum number of points for the exam is at least 50 points.

<u>Part 1 of the exam task – Test control (50 tests)</u>

Part 2 of the examination ticket – Written answer to 4 questions / tasks

Determining the number of points that a student scored in a discipline

The grade in the discipline is determined as the sum of points for the current educational activity (at least 72) and points for the exam (at least 50).

Discipline points for students who have successfully completed the program are converted into a traditional 4-point scale according to the absolute criteria shown in the table:

Discipline points	Evaluation on a 4-point scale
From 170 to 200 points	5 (excellent)
From 140 to 169 points	4 (good)
From 122 to 139 points	3 (satisfactory)
Below the minimum number of points that the student must score	2 (unsatisfactory)
